Textile “Pinch Pot” Vessels

Student Supply List

- **Fabrics and Paper** – it is easiest to think of a colour scheme you would like to work in – such as brights, black/white, neutrals and bring many (15-20+) small pieces, each not much larger than 12” x 18”. Do the same for your papers – thin papers can be glued together, papers can be torn, cut into, or layered – consider that some papers will need to stand up to hand stitching.
- Consider a variety of texture and value – we will add marks and patterns to the fabrics and papers.
- **Threads** – a variety of threads suitable for hand work – not machine threads unless heavier weights. Embroidery floss, perle cotton, hemp, linen – choose within your colour scheme.
- **Needles** – suitable for use with the threads you bring
- **Paints** – choose 3-4 colours of acrylic paints within your chosen palette, plus black and white. These can be inexpensive paints! If you have textile paints, bring those but I will provide textile medium to work with.
- **Embellishments** – buttons, beads, charms, shells, old jewelry – look around and try something new! Stems, sticks, nails for supports – I will bring extras.
- **Sketchbook or papers** - for notes, ideas and sampling – suggest at least 9” x 12”
- **Sewing Supplies** – paper and fabric scissors, small snips or embroidery scissors, awl, thimble (if you use one), pins, paper or small bulldog clips (for holding pieces together during construction) seam ripper. 1 yard of paper backed fusible web (Wonder Under or Steam a Seam)
- **Painting Supplies** – a small (3-4) selection of brushes, suitable for acrylic paints and glues, one fine, the rest ½” – 2”, plastic container for water and one for rinsing, 2-3 small container or palette to hold paint (styro meat trays) 3-4 mark making tools (we will also source some items such as twigs and stems and hopefully share others)
- **Other Supplies** – plastic to cover work surface, plus several 18” square pieces to move fabric to another area to dry. A couple rags for wiping, apron or coverup. Self-healing mat, cutter and ruler – only if you are not traveling a distance – I will bring mine to share. Art knife with extra blades.

Optional - If you have space – bring more fabrics, papers and threads plus any items that you’d like to try for support/structure. Remember that we have only two days for working so plan accordingly!

Instructor comments: I will bring my sewing machine for student use with a small selection of neutral threads. I will also bring extra paints, mediums, mark making tools. I will also bring my rotary cutting mat, ruler and cutter. If you are coming by air or distance – they are for you to use.
